FAITH IN THE WORD

For the week of The First Sunday in Lent, Invocabit March 9 – 15, AD 2025

e could sum up the will of God in the following way: The will of God is that sinners receive the salvation of God in Christ and that each of us is living a life of love toward God and our neighbor. There are a lot of specifics there. That means that things like hearing God's Word, prayer, being baptized, and receiving Holy Communion are not options that we are free to do or not do. It also means that we can't deal with our neighbor in anger or jealousy or covetousness. But that also means that we are given a great deal of latitude in our lives. There are so many ways in which we can go about loving our neighbor, providing for their temporal good and sharing with them the good news of Jesus. As Christians our will should look exactly like God's will. We don't expect that the will of our own flesh will look anything like God's will because the will of our sinful nature is, in every way, contrary to God's will. But Christ has set us free through the forgiveness of all our sins, so that now we can not only know but love and pray for the good and gracious will of God in our midst. Thus, it is to be our joy to hear God's Word and to walk the way of love. True, the third petition is a prayer against ourselves and our will, but that is only to pray against everything that is evil and harmful both to ourselves and to our neighbors. God grant that by His Holy Spirit we would know and love the good and gracious will of God and joyfully walk according to it in faith toward Him and in fervent love toward one another.

The Catechism

As the head of the family should teach it in a simple way to the household. Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able, or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.

The Lord's Prayer: The Third Petition

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

What does this mean? The good and gracious will of God is done even without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may be done among us also.

How is God's will done? God's will is done when He breaks and hinders every evil plan and purpose of the devil, the world, and our sinful nature, which do not want us to hallow God's name or let His kingdom come and when He strengthens and keeps us firm in His Word and faith until we die.

This is His good and gracious will.
